## Ad Hoc Building Committee Update

We have already accepted the proposal for the removal of the spire from Chris Burgess, The Burgess Company, of Pembroke MA.

Chris's original proposal included capping the belfry with a temporary (but sturdy!) rubber roof. Due to the weather this summer, the schedule has been pushed back. At this point, if the weather cooperates, the spire is scheduled to be removed by the end of September.

Chris is also developing a proposal for installing a permanent roof on which the weathervane can be reinstalled. The cost of a dome-shaped roof was originally deemed prohibitively expensive, but Chris has since suggested creating a domed roof from AZEK™, which can be heated and shaped, and then will be

maintenance free. **He is basing his design on the picture shown here** that A.J.

Heidkamp created a year or so back to give us an idea of how the church might look without a spire.

The Ad-Hoc Building Committee is on call to meet as soon as this second proposal is ready.

All members and active friends of the congregation will be notified via email or telephone when any work is definitely scheduled.

### **News From The Board of Management— the Warrant Explained and a Ministerial Search Update**

As the Warrant states, we are holding a congregational vote on Sunday September 7 to affirm our decision to hire a consulting minister rather than enter into the process of calling a “settled” minister at this time. While our District Executive, Rev. Terasa Cooley, indicated that no congregational vote is legally necessary, the Board of Management feels it is important to document that the congregation has been kept informed and is comfortable with the decision to hire a Consulting Minister.

While only members can vote, we hope everyone will stay for the meeting as it will also include an opportunity to ask questions about the hiring process and also get the latest update about potential candidates and any interviews completed by that point. In fact, we do have an interview scheduled on September 2. So, things are moving along!

### **What’s in a Mission?**

At our Annual Board Retreat in August, the Board of Management (BOM) spent most of the day updating our Congregational Record. This document is created during the ministerial search process and posted with the UUA so potential candidates can learn about the congregation. It also functions to help a congregation learn more about itself!

Although not required when searching for a consulting (versus called) minister, the BOM felt it made sense to update the document created during the 2004 search process so that we would have a clear current picture of our congregation to present to ministerial candidates.

In addition, working through the questions provided a great segue to starting the process of articulating our Mission Statement and our Mission(s), which was the focus of the shorter afternoon segment of the Board Retreat.

BOM members brainstormed ideas for both a mission statement and our mission, once we figured out which was which.

**So, what is a Mission Statement? What is a Mission? What's the difference?**

A “**Mission Statement**” states who we are and why we exist.

Here is a working draft Mission Statement:

The purpose of the Wakefield Unitarian Universalist Church is to provide a progressive religious presence in our community that is nonjudgmental and welcoming.

A “**Mission**” is what we do for, or offer to the larger community.

Example: one mission of the First Baptist Church in Wakefield is housing the Wakefield Interfaith Food Pantry. One mission of the Congo Church is housing the Clothes Closet (free clothing); another is preparing and serving meals to the community at holiday times.

**Note:** Missions do not have to be social service oriented. Here are some questions to help narrow down Mission choices:

What are the strengths of our congregation and our members? What are the greatest needs in our larger community? What do we do? How do we bring our faith (or aspects of our faith) into the larger community?

**Now it is YOUR turn to brainstorm!**

To start you off, here are the BOM brainstorming ideas:

- a spiritual home for people of diverse beliefs
- a progressive voice in the community at large
- we learn together, grow and then take that out to the community
- Providing a venue/resource to the congregation and the community at large [e.g. fundraising concerts]
- service is its prayer via social action
- 7 UU principles- exploring and reflecting and

living out our UU principles

- foster an environment where people are supported for the civic work they choose to do
- openness to have differing beliefs
- words of the chalice lighting
- foster and nurture one another in our spiritual journey or quest for truth

**Now it really IS your turn!**
